- Most raised beds have been fitted with new micro jet irrigation systems; table beds are to follow. After the hurricanes the Board has decided each tenant to be responsible of providing their own timer.
- 300-gallon trough donated during Fall Plant Sale by Apollo Beach neighbors. Red hybrid Jaboticabas to be planted in it.
- Grants and donations have made it possible to add several new trees to replace lost ones. Signage is in place for these at the garden: 2 mulberries, 1 avocado, 1 jackfruit, 1 banana, 1 black sapote, 1 white sapote and more.
- Row A community plantings as of 11/26: Rocket Arugula, Chinese Cabbage, Uberlandia Carrots and Cherokee Purple Tomatoes

ABGC Plant Sale Market & Marketing

Hello fellow garden club members. Hoping you had a wonderful

Thanksgiving holiday and are enjoying the end of year festivities coming into the new year. Everyone is quite busy with the holiday fun, but it is time to start sowing seeds for our Spring Plant Sale on Saturday, February 8, 2025. Please start getting some seeds into trays this week so we can have robust plants on offer in 8 weeks. The ideal pot size is four inches, holding a robust, disease free plant with good root development at sale time.

This year we are highly focused on providing vegetable and fruit starts and trees that can withstand and keep producing in our Florida Spring and Summer Gardens. Please consider creating lots of different herbs both annual and perennial; particularly in the Mediterranean category. The herb Wishlist includes Rosemary; Greek Oregano; Italian Oregano; Thai, Opal and Ethiopian Basil; Fernleaf and Mammoth Dill; Thyme; Sage; Parsley (Italian); Chives (regular); and Sorrel.

There is also a focus on providing more local/heat tolerant greens. We are encouraging our members to create Swiss Chard, mustard and collard greens, Longevity and Malabar Spinach, Tuscan Kale, Bok Choy and Chinese Cabbage to have on offer.

Native flowers and pollinator attractors will be a feature in the plant sale because every prolific garden requires relentless pollinators.

For tomatoes, the varieties should be both heat and disease resistant. I have personally purchased seeds for the Mortgage Lifter VFN, Tropic VFN, Japanese Black Trifele and Garden Peach Tomato varieties. I've been dying to try growing a Mortgage Lifter for years but could never find seeds or a start. I am truly "giggity" to grow these tomatoes this year and provide starts to be on offer for others in February. If you don't know what a Mortgage Lifter tomato is, do a quick search online. It's a great story and sounds like an even better tomato that rivals or surpasses the Ugly Ripe Tomatoes from Publix.

As the Plant Sale Committee Chair, I am super excited to come into spring with new passion, new energy, and an incredible offering of plants that our patrons will be excited about. I want to make sure that the excitement lasts through the season with patrons who are over the moon about the plants they got from us so they can grow with us year after year.

Let's go large this Spring! Let's be the "go-to" place for quality, unique and rare food plants. We can do it just by planting those seeds now. That's what I love the most about gardening. Often times, you are just planting seeds of intention as you are putting those seeds in the ground. Let's plant those seeds of intention for a magical and productive new year.

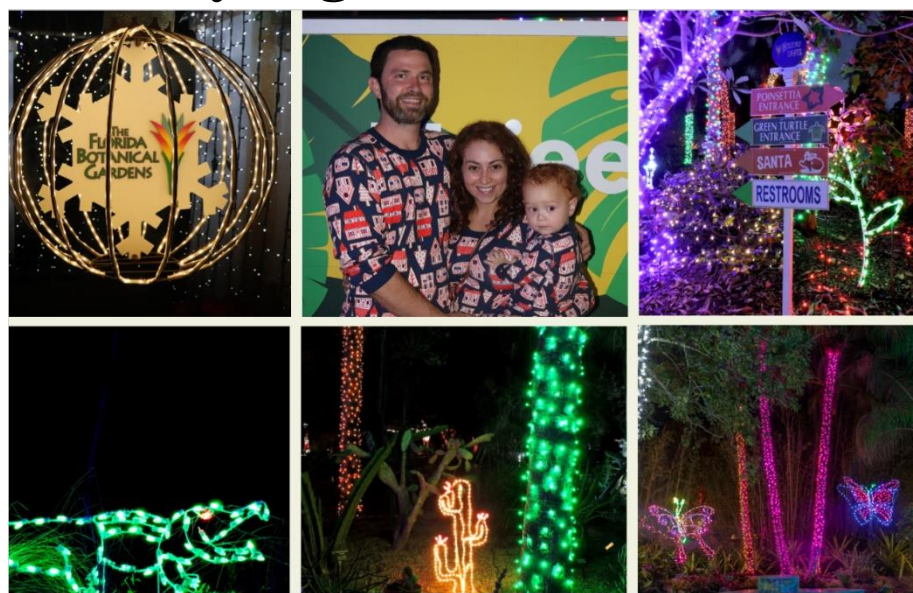
