Welcome to September and although still very warm, we are planning for the planting season nearer the end of the month by

starting seeds in the Saturday work time. If not seed starting, then transplanting to larger pots seedlings we are getting ready for the Fall Plant Sale on November 8th. Mark your calendar and time you can give, as its always all hands are needed!!!

Our first of the season membership meeting, our Annual Meeting, is *Tuesday September 16th at 6:30*. We have By Laws revisions to consider and vote on. They were attached to the August Leaf Newsletter email all current members received. We have some new members and will attach again for them this month. One of the changes in the By Laws revision is increasing the dues to automatically include the Florida Federation of Garden Clubs (FFGC) annual dues of \$12 per person. Our Club has been a recognized Garden Club with FFGC since 2017 when we were formed by the original Board. Many of us have paid dues to both the ABGC and FFGC yearly. Why? You might ask?

Being a member means I am participating in an organization at both the State and National level. I am dedicated to promoting the love of gardening, floral and landscape design; and civic and environmental responsibility. I am offered educational opportunities in person at quarterly meetings of District VIII, at the annual Convention in April, courses in person or via webinar. The courses in Environmental Conservation, Botany, Horticulture and Floral & Landscape Design led to certification in those areas. We have had speakers from FFGC at our meetings.

Along the way there is networking with of likeminded individuals, sharing of gardening tips and techniques. Much is shared in the quarterly publications from FFGC and the National Garden Club (NGC) which are on line at <http://www.ffgc.org> where you can find all things pertinent to our District VIII, FFGC and a link to our national organization. We have received Grants to start our Club and this last year to help restore your Community Forest Garden after the storms from FFGC and other member clubs.

The last two years we were a part of the Plant Trees on January 6th, and the Federation provided the funds for us and other Clubs to purchase Florida native trees the first year. This was a part of beautifying the community. We participate in the conservation of natural resources, promoting sustainability, and protecting the environment for future generations.

Speaking of future generations there is a summer camp for youngsters, and guidance for school programs and ways to get children into the community gardens. Instilling a love of gardening and environmental respect in young people begins early.

We want these resources and benefits to continue to be available through our support. If you did not join the FFGC when you paid your dues this year please reconsider and add the \$12.

Thank you all for what you do to help make this a Club that meets your needs. Is respected by the community and recognized by the State & National Garden organizations.

August was quite a busy month, with lots of new volunteers becoming new, active members and bed renters. It is exciting to see so many new faces and see the results of their help and volunteering. We started our Planting Parties on Saturdays this month and our fall plant inventory is off to a wonderful start. We already have a selection of peppers, French Sorrel, Italian Parsley, Celery, Tuscan Kale (Dinosaur Kale), Italian Oregano, Sage and Sweet Basil coming along nicely. Plus, way, way more to come.

Paula has volunteered to create the flower and pollinator selection of plants we will have available with a laser focus on native plants that support our Monarchs. One of our new members, Diane, has been bitten by the seed starting bug. It makes me smile to see her so excited about the Broccoli and Cauliflower starts she is working on. She even just invested in some grow lights for her home growing area so she can do more plant starting &



growing. Kathleen is always trying things new, unique and interesting. I just love her sense of adventure to grow things and can't wait to see what she wants to grow for this sale. Lynn has lots of flowers coming up. We started a portion of our tomato seeds on the last Saturday in August and have more to sow the first Saturday of September. We'll save the tomato talk for next month, but I promise we will have a stellar selection and I can't wait to tell you all about them.

This **plant sale** is built around a carefully curated list of our best performing and best researched plant varieties for the fall season that people want and we can beam with pride to sell. We will have unique, rare and new things to try in addition to main garden staples of the best varieties. We will have plants that you simply can't find at big boxes. We started seed planting a bit earlier for this sale so we can bring the plants along to a hardy and robust size that can fetch a higher price and give our gardeners the best chance of success with a more well-established plant perfectly ready to start producing.

Every Saturday from now until **our plant sale**, we will be doing some type of "Planting Party" in addition to our garden chores for our volunteer day. Review of Raised Bed Lease process

Many approach members during Volunteer Work Days inquiring about the rental of a raised bed. Here is a refresher of the simple 3 step process!

Step 1.

Volunteer at least 10 hours on Tuesday and/or Saturday mornings. This will help us get to know each other and coach you on the basics of how the garden operates, where tools are and how to use them. During this time, you will also learn a bit about the [Lease Agreement](#) which you can download on the website. It is your responsibility to be familiar with its contents before you are assigned a raised bed. **Don't forget to sign-in the White Binder every time you come to volunteer so we can track your hours together.

Step 2.

Once the 10 hours have been completed, you are ready to fill out a [Membership Form](#) which can be downloaded from the website. You will bring this form together with corresponding payment to the following *Membership Meeting* on the 3rd Tuesday of the month at 6:30pm.

Step 3.

At the Membership Meeting, you will be assigned a raised bed after a brief quiz on the Lease Agreement. You are ready to garden away!

Before an available raised bed is assigned to you we ask that you donate 10 hours of your time by actively participating at volunteer days (Tuesdays and Saturday mornings from 9am-12:00pm); and are familiar with the *Raised Bed Lease Agreement* posted online at <https://apollobeachgardenclub.com/member-information/>. The *Raised Bed Lease Agreement* document acts as a binding contract which you will have to sign for below when renting a raised bed from the Apollo Beach Garden Club.
